
Hoffman Estates Park District Finances

2014 realized another financially strong performance for your Park District. The District's operational funds performed very well, exceeding our expected budget. During 2014, we completed our revised five year Comprehensive Master Plan which lays out our operational and capital infrastructure plans over the next five years. This plan includes our Capital Asset and Replacement Plan for this time period. The District has worked very hard to ensure that we will have adequate funding for all of our future capital projects. Our healthy financial reserves also allow for greater flexibility should any additional projects be pursued during this time period. The continued strong annual operations have allowed our funds to strengthen financially and help us to maintain the high level of facilities and services that we offer the community.


In 2014 we received the Nationally recognized Governmental Finance Officers Association Award for Excellence in Financial Reporting, a credit to the financial integrity to which we manage the District's finances. The majority of our

operational revenues are generated by fees charged for most District programs, classes, memberships and alternative revenue sources. We maximize our tax receipts and alternative revenues to provide for the numerous parks and facilities available to our residents. Our operating fund's financial performance is summarized in the 2014 Operating Funds chart.



The Year-end 2014 Fund Balance chart details the Park District's reserves by fund, which are maintained for different uses under the fund balance reserve policy of the District. All monies are reserved for use within their respective funds to help ensure cash flow, provide for operational and capital projects,

and ensure balanced budgets and fiscal responsibility for future years. These funds are properly segregated as such in our annual financial report which is available for review at our District administrative offices and at heparks.org, along with all of our other pertinent financial data for the last five years. 2014 Annual Report

From the Park Board of Commissioners -

We had a great year in 2014! It was our 50th year and we found so many ways to celebrate a half century of recreation, fitness and fun. It was also the year that we revised our Comprehensive Master Plan (CMP). The CMP is a five-year look ahead that determines future services, programs and facilities. The process started in September 2013 with input gathered via an Attitude and Interest Survey of residents, focus groups and interviews with community leaders. We analyzed trends, shifts in

demographics and changes in population. We also took an inventory of our current parks and facilities. From there, our Forward Planning Committee, which consists of community representatives, created a five year plan that includes:

Capital Improvement Plan, including a plan to repair and maintain current facilities and parks and proposed new projects.

Strategic Plan, that revised the mission statement to include "providing enjoyable and healthy experiences for all people and sets goals." The new goals focus on healthy initiatives

Each of the three Park Board sub committees (Recreation Committee, Buildings and Grounds Committee, Administration and Finance Committee) reviewed the CMP drafts and gave input throughout the process as applied to their areas. Then, we held a meeting in December to gain public input on the plan.

The final document features conclusions in our administrative and recreation areas and in parks and facilities. To read the CMP, visit *heparks.org*.


