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MINUTES RECREATION COMMITTEE MEETING February 18, 2020

1. <u>Roll Call:</u>

A regular meeting of the Hoffman Estates Park District Recreation Committee was held on February 18, 2020 at 7:49 p.m. at the Triphahn Center in Hoffman Estates, IL.

2. Approval of Agenda:

Comm Rep Macdonald made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to approve the agenda as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

3. <u>Approval of the Minutes:</u>

Comm Rep Henderson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to approve the minutes of the January 21, 2020 meeting as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

6. <u>New Business:</u>

A. LiveBarn Agreement/M20-018:

Director Kapusinski reviewed the item noting that the hockey community was requesting this service. She explained that LiveBarn would films games and make them available on phones for viewing. She noted that the cameras could be turned off (Wolves) or they could use a password to only allow specific participants to view a game. She also noted that the recordings would be available for 30 days.

Commissioner McGinn asked if it would be for both rinks and it was noted that it would. Comm Rep Henderson asked if there was an issue would it be dealt with by LiveBarn and it was noted that it would.

Comm Rep Macdonald asked about the band width used and Executive Director Talsma noted that the requirements had been reviewed by IT Manager Agudelo and there was no concern.

Commissioner K. Evans asked what might happen if the park district inadvertently turned the cameras off during a game and Executive Director Talsma noted that without malicious intent, the consequences would be only to the disappointed public.

Comm Rep Henderson asked if there was a minimum of subscribers needed and it was noted that there was not.

President Kaplan asked about the viewpoint and Director Kapusinski noted that there was a camera for the entire rink and one following the puck. President Kaplan asked about a coach wanting a copy of the game and Executive Director Talsma noted that would be an issue to take up with LiveBarn.

Comm Rep Macdonald made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to recommend the board approve the LiveBarn agreement as outlined in M20-018. The motion carried by voice vote.

B. Rec Board Report/M20-025:

Director Kapusinski reviewed the report noting that the Silver Sneakers membership was up, that they were partnering with Cook County Forest Preserve for programming, that the ESports Tournament was very well received as was the Ice Show with 250 participants and 30 soloists. The committee viewed the annual report and it was very well received. Staff was commended on their efforts.

Commissioner McGinn asked about the advertising on the boards at the rink and Executive Director Talsma noted that it was done by the Wolves and that they had paid in full.

Comm Rep Henderson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to send the Rec Board Report M20-025 to the board as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

C. BPC Board Report M20-027:

Executive Director Talsma reviewed the report noting that Kurtis Hartwig had been hired as the Golf Operations Manager, that they were up to 15 weddings scheduled for 2020 and working on maintaining the shoreline for 10 and 11.

Chairman K. Evans asked about using a wall and Director Hugen explained that they would lose too much with a wall.

President Kaplan asked about party rental minimums and Executive Director Talsma noted that it would depend on the room and date i.e. they would not necessarily rent out a banquet room on a popular Saturday night to a party of 25.

Comm Rep Macdonald made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to send the BPC Board Report M20-027 to the board as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

D. The Club Board Report/M20-026:

Executive Director Talsma reviewed the report noting that the renovation was going very well and the equipment was expected next week. He noted that in January The Club had 251 new members and over 100 HIIT program members more than making up the tennis member revenue.

Comm Rep Henderson asked if the soft opening was open to the public and it was noted that the Grand Opening was a public event and the soft opening would be for members.

Comm Rep Henderson made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Chhatwani to send The Club Board Report M20-026 to the board as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

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7. <u>Committee Member Comments:</u>

The Comm Reps acknowledged the great job staff was doing.

Chairman K. Evans reminded all of the Mayors Breakfast Thursday and the Legislative Breakfast Saturday.

Golf Maintenance Summary

In February, our high averaged 34° (1° below average) and low averaged 20° (about average). In February, we received about .5" of rain (1.79" average) and about 4" of snow (our average is 9.1"). This winter's total snowfall amounts to 18.3" (29.5" average).

In the beginning of the month, we continued working on the bank stabilization project on #11. After a few cold nights, when the ground was nice and firm, we were able to push the many tons of rock into the pond with little to no damage to the bank. With the help of Parks Maintenance, and their backhoe, this was a very quick and easy task.

Towards the end of the month, the maintenance team had the opportunity to be one of the stops on the Chicagoland Association of Golf Course Superintendents annual shop tour. This is a great event during which two to three golf courses open their shops for association members to see how they operate and to share ideas. This year, Bridges of Poplar Creek and Medinah Country Club were the participating courses. This was one of the biggest in recent years with over 130 Superintendents, Assistants, Equipment Managers, and maintenance staff members in attendance.

Here is a small list of some of the other tasks the maintenance team has been working on in February:

- Ground stumps from tree removals
- Deep cleaned the whole shop in preparation for Shop Tour and beginning of season.
- Finished preventative maintenance on rotary mowers.
- Continued preventative maintenance on maintenance cart fleet.

Member Services/Sales

- The sales team was able to secure 105 new members in February. We had a strong January along with a low number of cancellations, so even though 105 is less than the desired amount of 135 new memberships, we are still at a net 21 for the year.
- In February, we offered a reduced enrollment fee of \$14 to start the month followed by a flash sale mid-month offering \$2 enrollment for three days. This strategy brought in 19 new members.
- The sales team has been meeting regularly for training sessions with our consultant Mark Davis. The objective of these regular training sessions is to improve and organize our sales process for consistency and success.
- Member Retention Efforts: We are researching a nutrition program that we may be able to offer to members as part of a test market. We are working on learning and implementing two new programs, MyZone and MINDBODY, which will provide a retention tool through phone apps to our members.

Operations and Fitness Departments:

- February has been extremely busy with the renovation project (see the project updates list below).
- The HIIT coordinator has continued with an agenda of creating programs, and learning the MYZone heart rate system to prepare for the launch of the new HIIT Club program.
- MYZone heart rate bands have been distributed to all HIIT instructors, so they can learn how the system works from the user interface.
- The Operations Department has been focusing on filling the two currently vacant overnight FT positions in the custodial department.

Renovation & Project Updates:

- All equipment has been delivered and set up in the new area.
- Mural has been completed and we are still receiving lots of great comments on how unique it is.

- Sound panels have been installed.
- Carpet bid has been completed and installation is scheduled for the week of March 16th.
- New studio floor has been selected and the vendor plans to begin installation the week of March 16th.
- New lighting and speakers have been installed in the new space
- New WiFi, cameras, and TVs have been installed in the new space
- Marketing efforts have geared up to transition to "now open" on Saturday, March 14.
