Motion:

Recommend to the full board to restore a 2- to 5-year-old water feature at Seascape for cost not to exceed \$15,000, rather than replacing the unit as originally planned.

Background:

The board approved a budget of \$80,000 in 2024 to replace the 2 to 5-year-old aquatic feature at Seascape. The work was planned to take place once the pool closed for the year. However, while researching design options, it was discovered that we could have the existing structure refurbished for a cost of \$15,000, while extending the useful life by three to five years.

Prior to looking into the refurbishing option, we worked with multiple vendors on the design for the replacement while avoiding having to install new pipes to the feature. The following list outlines the options that would be able to use the existing pipes:

\$70,000
\$167,000
\$69,345
\$76,580
\$122,670

These costs do not include installation, which could range from \$10,000 to \$25,000. The \$80,000 budget for this project was intended to include the aquatic feature and installation.

Rationale:

We reached out to the contractor that restored all of our waterslides at Seascape to look into restoring the structure that we have. The panels on the structures can be replaced as well as the stairs and railings. The slide can be refurbished just like our other slides and then the entire feature painted to the colors of our liking.

This can all be accomplished for a cost not to exceed \$15,000. Staff feels that by completing this refurbishment, the feature would not need to be replaced for another three to five years.

Member Services/Sales

- The Club team enrolled 102 new members in April, offering an enrollment fee of \$29 PLUS the month of September free. We started the month off fairly slow again but finished strong enrolling 22 new members on the last day of the month! We are very pleased to see that this aggressive enrollment offer resulted in a decent overall number for the month.
- In April, we continued the offer of a free month to existing members who referred new members. We pushed the promotion a little more, including it on an all-member email that went out mid-month and received 15 referrals from existing members referring new members. This is a decent number, with almost 15% of the April new members being from a referral.
- The Club had 2,172 unique visits in April, meaning approximately 77% of members visited/used the facility at least once in April. We are beginning to see a drop in this number, which is normal, indicating better weather and less inside workouts.
- The Club had 103 United Healthcare Renew Active pass holders use the facility in April (visiting at least one time).
- Club staff completed an outreach event at Hoffman Estates High School on April 30 and May 1, participating as a vendor at the Annual Wellness Fair. We promoted our student summer pass as well as our special corporate rates for the staff of the school district. Staff enjoyed engaging the kids through activities and challenges while giving away some prizes throughout the two-day event.



Operations and Fitness Departments:

- The Club rentals stats for March:
 - o (35) volleyball rentals; (2) Birthday parties; (1) Soccer rental
 - o (42) basketball rentals; (14) Pickleball court rentals
- The Club offered and ran the following programming and specials in April
 - Personal Training special price on pkg of 10 sessions (special price \$495) sold 25 packages of 10 sessions, 2 packages of 3 sessions, and 1 package of 5 sessions.
 - o Pickleball 101/102 (5 classes)
- Club staff introduced a couple of retention events in April
 - "Guess the Golf Tees"
 - members took their best guess at the number of golf tees in a container at the desk. Winners received Top Tracer passes as well as a Club Cooler with some Club swag
 - Ascension
 - Nutrition Table with Registered Dietician April 25th
 - Step into Summer Walking Challenge
 - A program that encourages members to be aware of the number of steps they take each day and record them by placing and moving their personal butterfly cut out along the wall of the main hallway.

Ice Department

Ice:

- The two tournaments in April went well. We hosted teams from all over the country including California, Canada, Florida, and New York.
- The CCM Shuffle Tournament (4/19-4/22) utilized 47 game slots; MYHockey Tournament (4/26-4/28) utilized 54 games slots.
- We hosted overflow games for a (UHT) Ultimate Hockey Tournament totaling 20 game slots May 3-May 5.
- We are hosting tournaments May 17-19 (MYHockey), May 31-June 2 (TCS) and end of the season playoffs for NWHL June 7-9.
- We are working through fall and spring 2025 to get additional tournaments set up including hosting a TCS tournament over MLK weekend.
- The annual ice melt will take place on Rink 1 starting July 26 and hopefully be ready after Labor Day.
- Finalizing all Timberwolves, Starlights, Glen Ellen Speed Skating ice for Fall. Including a possibility of bringing in one or two more renters if ice is available.

Figure Skating:

- We hired Jacquelyn Johnson (Scott) as our new figure skating manager. She has been with us since 2018 working figure skating classes, special events, and numerous ice shows we've held.
- Hosting a USF on-ice/off-ice seminar on both rinks featuring several professional figure skaters on July 20.
- Our ice show "Beach Party" was held on May 11 at 3pm. The event went great and sold 297 tickets.

- The ice show had 50 acts including solos, duets, trios, and group numbers, with the show lasting just under 2.5 hours.
- Figure Skating classes for spring are coming to an end; currently have 348 registered.

Public Skate:

- Due to tournaments, we had limited public skate sessions this month.
- Two (2) Public Skate sessions totaling 133 patrons for April

Hockey:

- Working on finalizing summer programing times including a new clinic called "Hoffman Summer Hockey Clincs" for Wolfpack and Wolverine girls players.
