MINUTES RECREATION & FACILITIES COMMITTEE MEETING October 15, 2024

1. Roll Call:

A regular meeting of the Hoffman Estates Park District Recreation & Facilities Committee was held on October 15, 2024, at 7:30 p.m. at the Triphahn Center in Hoffman Estates, IL.

2. Approval of Agenda:

Commissioner Dressler made a motion, seconded by Comm Rep Beranek, to approve the agenda as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

3. Approval of the Minutes:

Comm Rep Bettencourt made a motion, seconded by Comm Rep Beranek, to approve the minutes of the September 17, 2024, meeting as presented. The motion carried by voice vote.

6. New Business:

A. Little Stars Childcare / M24-082

Comm Rep Bettencourt made a motion, seconded by Comm Rep Beranek to recommend to the full board the approval of discontinuing the district's Little Stars Childcare program as of May 30, 2025.

Executive Director Talsma explained that this would not require board approval, but we wanted to make the board aware of what we are looking at operationally. We are not looking to make a profit with this program, but do not want to operate at a loss. This is not something that should not operate through tax dollars as it serves a small number of residents. Staff discussed the reasons behind the decision and noted that plans are to run the program through May 2025.

Commissioner Evans asked if we would lose staff when they learn of the closing, and would we offer a retention bonus to stay through May. Executive Director Talsma said we have other staff who can fill in, and we will look into the retention bonus idea.

Commissioner Dressler asked what our fees are compared to other options in the immediate area. Executive Director Talsma said that we are probably a little less expensive, but we also are not a full facility, with students remaining in just one room plus a playground. If we increase fees, we are not competitive based on what we offer.

Comm Rep Beranek noted that there is not an absence of choices in childcare at a competitive rate in this area. She asked if there were other options in the area that would allow those covered by the state to still get that benefit. Superintendent Barton said there are at least two others in the immediate area who can accept the Illinois childcare assistance.

The motion carried by voice vote.

B. Recreation Board Report and 3Q2024 Goals / M24-081

Comm Rep Beranek made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Dressler to forward the October Recreation Board Report and 3Q2024 Goals to be included in the October Executive Director's Report.

Director Miletic highlighted the following items for the Recreation Department:

- We held a pop-up sports event to promote our different sports offerings
- The HOTT Theater group is remaining popular with 31 in the Frozen Junior production
- The dance company started a pre-company program
- The seniors have been busy and went to an apple orchard this week
- Haunted Hoffman Family Fest will be this coming Saturday the majority of the event is free for everyone (the Trick or Treat path has a small fee)

Executive Director Talsma noted that he is currently the chairperson of NWSRA, an association which provides special recreation services for 17 area park districts. We are currently analyzing this and looking at different concepts as some services have not been provided as promised. We are looking at how to make things better with some nearby districts. We will give NWSRA a chance to get things back on track this year and will reevaluate for 2026.

The motion carried by voice vote.

C. Facilities and Marketing Board Report / M24-083

Comm Rep Bettencourt made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Dressler, to forward the Facilities & Marketing October Board Report and 3Q2024 Goals to be included in the October Executive Director's Report.

Deputy Director Bechtold highlighted the following from the report:

- The golf course has had a great season with 1,600 rounds more than 2023 so far. We are hoping for good weather for the rest of the year. Toptracer is also doing well.
- The ice rink recently held the Pink the Rink open skate, which was a nice partnership with Ascension.
- The Club had an open house on October 5; 64 new members signed up.
- Marketing is focusing on many special fall events and looking ahead to winter. The Club has a new website which looks great; different apps are available, and swim lane reservations can be made online now.
- Three of the four marquee signs are up and running. We will be changing the lettering on the permanent section of the sign structures.

Director Bechtold stated that the Wolves contract goes through May 2025. Construction has started on their new rink in Rosemont, and they will move in Fall 2025. We have discussed the possibility of extending their lease by a month or two depending on construction. Going forward, we have interest from a minor league team/coaching company looking to use our ice and locker rooms.

The motion carried by voice vote.

7. <u>Committee Member Comments:</u>

Commissioner Dressler said the NRPA conference was a great three days.

Comm Rep Beranek is looking forward to the multi-sport madness program with her son.

Comm Rep Kulkarni said great job to everyone. The new marquee signs look great.

Commissioner MacGregor said the NRPA conference was excellent. He attended many different types of sessions. He is looking forward to seeing the progress at Vogelei; and the Triangle Preserve looks great.

School Days Out

- District 54 had a half day on October 30. 34 participants attended the program at the Triphahn Center.

- November 5 was a School Day Out for both District 54 and District 15. 33 participants attended the program. They went on a field trip to Enterrium, a restaurant with an arcade and bowling alley.
- We are currently taking enrollments for both school districts for Thanksgiving Break School Day Off programs. Field trips include Bowlero, Laser X, and AMC to see the new movie Moana 2. Currently there are 81 participants registered across the three days. Registration is open until November 18.



Youth Sports

A baseball banquet was held on October 25. We had an overwhelming amount of support. Well over 100 friends and family showed up to support the players. Players received their well-earned trophies. A new tradition was started to award season MVP's. Winners must exemplify leadership, teamwork, integrity, sportsmanship, and respect.

Registration for youth basketball ended October 31. We have increased registration numbers for both little hoopers basketball and youth 1st through 8th league compared to last year. Practices will begin for Little Hoopers 11/22, while youth basketball starts on November 11.

Contractual Sports

Contractual Athletic League:

• The youth soccer league has ended with 194 enrolled over age groups spanning Pre-K through 6th grade. Unfortunately, this was approximately 30% lower than last year. This was a rebuilding year as the Aces program took over. We have implemented suggestions and changes and have received positive reviews for the fall season. We expect this program to continue to grow.

Other Contractual Sports:

- Sports Kids, Inc. continues to offer great youth athletics programming
 - O Volleyball has been their most popular class offering but we are beginning to gain traction with Family Archery as well.
- Staff is currently reaching out to new contractual vendors to expand our offerings.
 - o Skyward Fencing, currently offering classes at Harper College, will begin offering classes at Willow Recreation Center beginning in January 2025.
 - Hoffman United Soccer Club concluded their outdoor fundamental classes
 October 31. They will not host indoor soccer and will resume in spring 2025.

Adult Sports

- The indoor pickleball season began October 7 and is currently still going on. The league has 19 teams in total and will end on December 9. A pickleball tournament to be hosted at the NOW Arena is scheduled for February 23. This tournament is a joint partnership with THE Club and Windy City Bulls. - Fall adult softball season started August 26 and concluded October 14. Games were played on Monday nights at Cannon Crossing. We look to enhance and grow this league for summer 2025.

The Club Swim Lessons:

The second six-week session for fall swim lessons began on October 19 and will be running through November 21. Fall Session 2 has seen an upward trend in enrollment of 15 additional kids. Eight of the 15 kids were moved off our waitlist and two additional classes were opened on Wednesday evenings! Consistent instructors, open communication to families via email, and phone calls have helped the program continue to grow. 
Member Services/Sales & Fitness

- October New Member Enrollments: The Club team enrolled 118 new members in October. The team started the month strongly with our annual Open House Event on Oct 5. We had an impressive 47 people take advantage of the \$0 enrollment fee PLUS t-shirt promotion in conjunction with the open house, 40% of the total enrollments for the month! The Open House Event welcomed the community to come in and experience The Club, take complimentary classes, visit with vendors, talk to personal trainers and instructors, participate in complimentary chair massages from our massage therapists, and flu shots from Ascension.
- A special thank you to all of our vendors who took part in the event and/or donated to the raffle prizes. Dick Pond Athletics Hoffman Estates, Coopers Hawk Arboretum, Ascension, Windy City Bulls, Pinstripes Arboretum, Rookies Hoffman Estates, I Smell Bacon Hoffman Estates, Spoiled Gemz local rep, Brian Dumler, Golf Pro w/ youth golf activity.
- Referral Program Success: To reward loyal members, we continued our exciting offer of a complimentary month of membership for those who referred new members in October. We had 12 successful member referrals, each of which demonstrates the power of word-of-mouth and the trust our members place in the Club.
- United Healthcare Renew Active Program: We had 111 Renew Active pass holders visit the Club in October, with 4 new members joining through the program this month. We are seeing a slight uptick in visits from these passholders, as expected, with the cooler weather beginning.
- Member Engagement and Facility Usage: October saw 2,117 unique member visits, meaning approximately 75% of our total members actively used the facility during the month. We are beginning to see this percentage increase as we start the busier season.
- Community Outreach: In addition to the Open House event this month, The Club staff participated in the annual Haunted Hoffman Event, leading community members in a family "Zombie Zumba" dance party at the park.




